DEFEATS TWO BURGLARS

Despite Twenty Wounds, Old Man Holds Assaults Until Police Arrive.

Paris, Feb. 3.—An extraordinary account of the desperate and successful struggle of a man of 55 with two burglars was given at the assize courts here yesterday.

Mr. Van der Nest, who lives next door to Baron Rothschild at Boulogne-sur-Seine, was sleeping alone in the house, when he was awakened by the noise made by two burglars. In spite of his great age, he got out of bed, snatched up two revolvers and met the burglars at the top of the staircase.

The old man fired, wounding one of the burglars. He then flung the other weapon in the face of the other man, and immediately dashed at him. In the course of the desperate struggle which followed the old man was badly knocked about, but when neighbors who heard the noise arrived they found him sitting on one burglar and holding the other down by the hair. Mr. Van der Nest had 22 severe bruises on his head and face, inflicted with a "life preserver."

In court yesterday, the old man, who was warmly complimented by the judge, declared that he suffered no ill-effects from his encounter. Except for a little deafness he had never been better in his life. "I think the exercise did me good," he added.

ONTARIO'S CASHIER RESIGNS

Mr. G. W. Duncan Appointed in 1887 Going Into Private Business.

Toronto, Feb. 3.—G. W. Duncan, cashier in the provincial treasury department, has resigned. The vacancy will be filled by promotion, details of which have not yet transpired; meanwhile C. H. Sproule, assistant treasurer, will take Mr. Duncan's place.

Mr. Duncan entered the civil service in 1887 and after experience in several departments was appointed cashier. Mr. Duncan is leaving voluntarily to go into business at Edmonton as a member of the firm of Duncan Bros. & Ruttars, general store.

BAD PICTON BLAZE

Pictou, Feb. 3.—Fire was discovered in the Jamieson block, which did considerable damage here early this morning.
