LOCAL MARKET.
London, Tuesday, Aug. 25.
The market today was well attended by farmers and buyers. Vegetables and fruits were again the chief imports. The prices offered. Sales were inclined to be slow, but there was not much change in prices.

Grain—The best oats sold at \$1.20 to \$1.30 per cwt; a couple of loads of inferior quality sold at \$1.10; old oats were scarce, at \$1.50 per cwt. Wheat was sold at \$1.50 per bu.

Hay and Straw—There was a fair demand for the 16 loads that were offered; prices were not as strong as yesterday, sales being made at \$10 to \$11.50 per ton. Straw plentiful and slow, at \$5.50 per ton.

Butter and Eggs—Although there was not a large supply of butter, the grocers and dealers did not seem anxious to purchase, and as a consequence trade was a little slow; prices were unchanged, at 22c for crocks and 24c for pound rolls in wholesale lots. Eggs were in fair demand, at 18c for crate and basket lots, and 20c for a single dozen.

Vegetables and Fruits—Potatoes were easier, selling at 7c to 8c per bu and at \$1.10 per bag; turnips and carrots, 35c per bu, and beets, 30c; onions, 8c to 9c per bu; tomatoes were plentiful and slow, at 20c per basket wholesale and 25c retail; cabbages, 40c per dozen; cauliflowers, 50c to \$1.50 per dozen; celery, 40c per dozen; cucumbers, 5c to 10c per dozen; pickling cucumbers, 20c per 100; pickling onions, 10c to 12c per cwt; and 70c to 75c per peck; rhubarb, 20c per dozen; lettuce, radishes, beets, carrots and onions, 15c to 20c per dozen; Hubbard squash, \$1 to \$1.50 per dozen.

Fruit—Apples scarce, but prices are no higher, at 30c to 40c per bu; pears in large supply, at 25c to 35c per bu for large and 20c for small; peaches could be had at 20c to \$1 per basket, the latter price for early Crawford's; plums, 40c to 50c per 1-quart basket; black cherries sold at 10c to 12c per box; muskmelons varied in price from 40c to \$3 per dozen.

Poultry—Old fowl were easier, at 7c per lb alive and 8c to 9c dressed; spring chickens, 10c per lb alive and 12c dressed; ducks, 8c alive and 10c dressed.

Dressed Hogs—The demand was brisk, at 25c per cwt.

Butchers' Meats—Beef sold at \$5.50 to \$7 per cwt; lamb, 12c to 13c per lb by the carcass; veal, \$3 to \$4, and mutton, \$5 to \$6 per cwt.

Wheat—Ontario old or new, No. 2 white active, 80c to 85c; No. 2 mixed, 85c to 90c; Manitoba first patents, 85c to 90c; Manitoba wheat is nominal, at \$1.11 to \$1.12 for No. 2 northern, at lake ports.

Barley—New No. 2, 55c to 58c; No. 3 extra, 50c to 55c; No. 4, 45c to 50c.

Oats—Ontario new, 30c to 40c outside; old are nominal, at 40c to 45c outside; Manitoba No. 2, 45c to 48c; rejects, 40c to 45c, at lake ports.

Rye—New, 60c to 70c outside; old, no stock.

Corn—Nominal, at 75c to 80c; Toronto freight, for No. 2 yellow, and 80c to 85c for kiln-dried.

Brain—Scarce and quiet; quoted at \$15 to \$18 per cwt in bulk, outside; in bags, 12c more.

Shorts—Strong but quiet, at \$20 to \$22 per ton in bulk, outside; in bags, \$2 more.

Flour—Manitoba first patents, 85c to 90c; strong bakers, 85c to 90c; Ontario winter wheat patents, \$3.20 to \$3.50.
