

Rate Fixed At 21 Mills

Council Passes the Rates and Taxes By-Law Without Amendment.

Revenue By-Law Laid Over—Complaint Against Electric Motors.

Yesterday evening's meeting of the city council was a spirited and businesslike one. The Rates and Taxes By-Law, 1900, which fixes the rate at 21 mills, was given its third reading and finally passed without amendment. The Revenue by-law which proposes to tax bicycles \$1 and realties \$2 was briefly discussed, but it was not dealt with.

With the exception of Ald. Beckwith, there was a full board present, with His Worship Mayor Hayward in the chair. The first communication was from Hon. E. G. Prior, acknowledging copy of a resolution re suggested removal of the lighthouse station, Dr. Montanari also wrote to the same effect. Received and filed.

J. E. Anderson, deputy minister of agriculture, transmitted a copy of the "Thistle Act." The post was increasing very much and he asked that steps be taken to eradicate the same.

Mr. Topp, city engineer, in answer to the Mayor, said four men were employed cutting down the thistles throughout the city.

Ald. Kinsman thought it would be well for the city to draw the attention of the provincial authorities to the Thistle Act. The communication was received, a suitable reply to be sent.

Thomas C. Sorby, in regard to the proposed permanent roadway across James bay, asked that he be remunerated for certain plans which he had drawn for the city in 1894. Referred to a special committee consisting of Ald. Yates, Hall and Kinsman.

Sol. Cadman complained that he had purchased a mare from the fire department officials under misrepresentation, and asked for remuneration to the extent of \$52. Received and referred to a special committee for report.

A. W. More & Co. asked that brokers' licenses be reduced from \$25 to \$10 per annum, when the Revenue by-law was passed. Received and referred to a special committee, consisting of Ald. Yates, Cooley and Brydon.

The city engineer reported adversely against the proposal to construct a bicyclic path along the north side of Simcoe street, below the yard. He recommended the laying of a crossing on Government street opposite the north line of Broughton street, at a cost of \$28.

The report was referred to the streets committee. A. R. Thompson and others, residing on Johnson street, east of Quadra, asked that the sewer be extended along that thoroughfare. Referred to streets committee.

The home committee recommended that an old man named Cruse be not admitted, though he should be provided for by the city, as he is a destitute pauper. Ald. Hall on this point diverted attention to the fact that one of the inmates at the Old Men's home was a fit subject for the insane asylum.

The report was adopted. The streets, sewers and bridges committee reported that owing to insufficient funds the council could not undertake to remove the sewage matter emptying into Rock bay from the Government street drains. A resolution endorsing this suggestion was passed.

The standing committee on finance recommended the proposed accounts amounting to \$7,211.33. Adopted. The Rates and Taxes By-Law, 1900, was next taken up, the council going into committee of the whole.

Ald. Cameron was in favor of exempting improvements from taxation. He moved that the by-law be amended and finally passed. The Revenue By-Law then came up for its second reading. It was briefly discussed, but laid over.

The Mayor inquired of Mr. Bradburn what had been done regarding the collection of the tax from the lawyers. Mr. Bradburn replied that Mr. Lindley Cress had been summoned, but the case has been adjourned, owing to the fact that Magistrate Hall had declined to sit on the case. Ald. Williams, seconded by Ald. Yates, moved that equity be made in respect to men who had made railway propositions to the city earlier in the year had any intention of going further with the matter. Ald. Hall had pleasure in informing the board that the first of the series of Sunday afternoon band concerts at the park was a great success, though many complained that starting the concert at 4 o'clock was an inconvenient hour.

The board then adjourned. LONDON'S LONGSHOREMEN. "Dockers" They Are Called, In the Old Country.

From the London Express. One must work, eat, drink, and sleep with dock laborer many months before you can understand the man and his devious ways.

The dockers of 1880, for instance, was not fighting for bread, but for more of another article, spelled with a P. Davy B. namely, beer—a fact which took some finding out.

Some two or three years ago the writer spent twelve months working as a docker in the London docks. He went into the docks with a certain sympathy for the dockers, but at the end of twelve months that sympathy had entirely vanished.

Ninety-eight per cent of the genus dockers are the merest dregs of bilious humanity, who, when not working in the docks, spend their time in loafing around the street corners and public houses.

The A men work under exactly the same conditions, with the exception that they are, however, seldom, if ever, idle. The B men are thus the only men who are actually speaking, casuals, they receive 3s. 9d. per day from April to the end of September, and 3s. 3d. the remaining months, and their hours of labor are seven and a half and six and a half per day respectively, the same as the permanent and A men. These latter are recruited from the B men, who are provided with numbered tickets. The advance to the superior position is taken in strict rotation, according to the seniority of the men.

With ordinary luck a man can work his way out of the B ranks in about six months of this period the dock laborer, with the exception of perhaps six weeks in the early autumn, have worked on an average five days per week. In addition to this pay, all ranks, when working piecework—and this is almost invariably the case—may receive anything from 3d. to 1.6d per day extra.

Occasionally, it must be admitted, a particular job may not pay, in which case nothing extra is allowed, but this is the exception rather than the rule. In addition to the regular pay, the dockers receive weekly overtime during busy spells, and after 8 a.m. a higher rate is paid. The fact is that even if the dockers received a regular sum of £2 per week, it would not be a better offer than they receive. The question does not lie with the matter of money. No one knows this better than the dockers. Give the dockers a permanent position at £1 per week, and the chances are ten to one that he does not avail himself of this opportunity. He will shake himself clear of the docks. This was just as applicable before the great strike, as after. Six typical dockers, who were thrown by chance, in the course of a conversation stated their candid opinion of the great strike. They were six very unambitious men, declaring that they were not benefited in the least by the strike. Yet each man was perfectly willing to strike for an extra penny per hour at any moment.

Outwardly the present strike appears to be caused by the question of whether the men shall be engaged outside or inside the docks. Two years ago the men did not care one jot either way. This being so, have the men changed their opinion since then? No.

The only cause of the present strike, whether it is great or little, is that old spirit of restlessness, now breaking out again, in a greater or less degree. Ordinarily, the dockers do not like work. So long as he can get round the street corners, with a pipe in his mouth and the price of a half pint of beer in his pocket, he is content.
