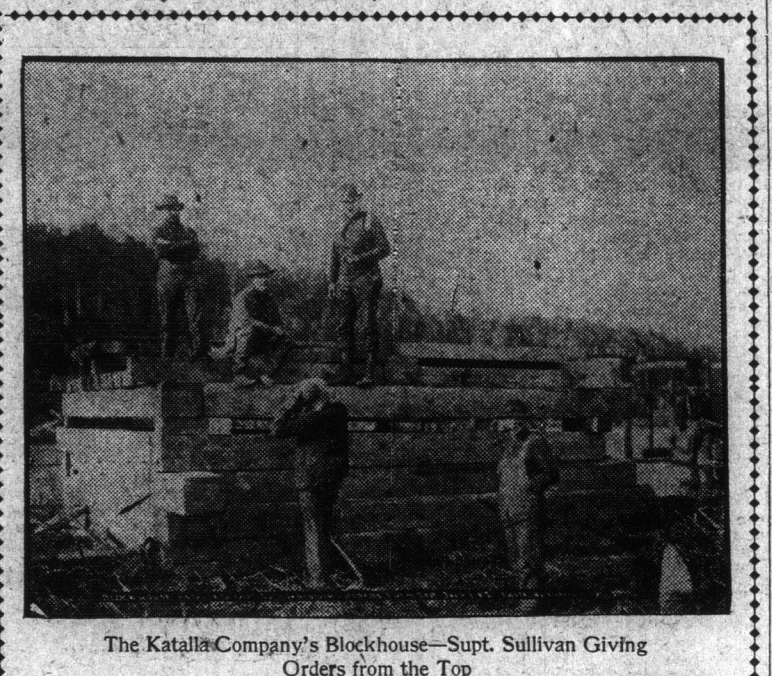

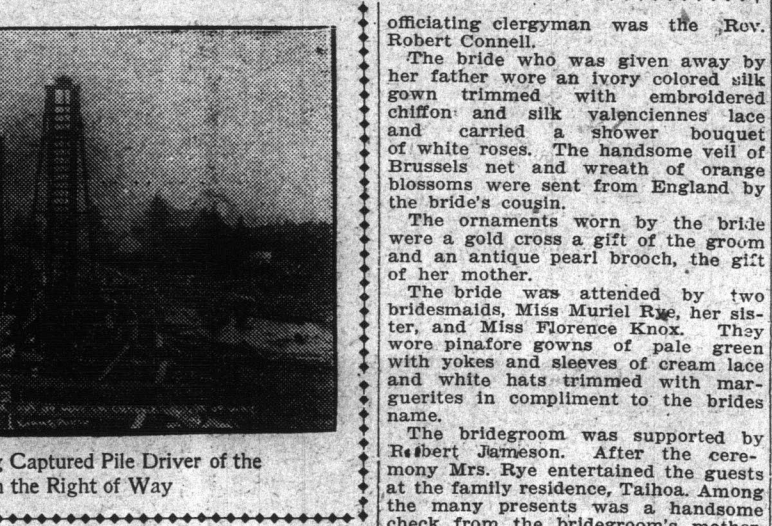

MORE JAPANESE Chargeurs Reunis Steamer Will Bring 300 More Coolies From Honolulu Following the steamer Kumeric, which left Honolulu on Saturday last, and is due on Tuesday with 1,177 Japanese, supplied by the steamer Kumeric, the steamer Amiral Dupere, of the Chargeurs Reunis, one of the French round-the-world vessels, is coming from Honolulu with 200 Japanese.
