him and she law. There are some twenty cases of detentions in the penitentiary by reason of the quarantine. The institution is also without a h ad, because the superintendent, whose term expired with Dec. 31, made haste to leave the place as soon as his official term ended. Indeed, he escaped an hour before that time, for fear he would be quarantined. The newly appointed Superintendent, Wallace A. Noble of this city, and his deputy refuse to enter on a performance of their duties if they are so be made prisoners as well as the criminals. The penitentiary is therefore in charge of the keepers, who are not over anxious to remain, and are said to be exceeding lax in discipline. The prisoners detained over their terms have threatened to revolt unless released from the perit to which, they say, keeping them in prison subjects them.
