Persons dying of small-pox, scarlet fever, diphtheria or cholera must be buried forthwith by private burial, and transportation of the corpse is forbidden. An effort will be made by the dametrment to proceedule all offender the department to prosecute all offenders, as there has been some laxity by the un-dertakers and others in their observance in the law. It is unlawful and inconvenient for relatives of the deceased to leave the obtaining of the permit to the undertaker, and the practice should be discouraged.




