ARTICLE III

The Commission shall make a thorough investigation into the natural story of the Fraser River sockeye salmon, into hatchery methods, spawning found conditions and other related matters. It shall conduct the sockeye mon fish cultural operations in the waters described in paragraphs numbered and 3 of Article I of this Convention, and to that end it shall have power to prove spawning grounds, construct, and maintain hatcheries, rearing ponds other such facilities as it may determine to be necessary for the propagaon of sockeye salmon in any of the waters covered by this Convention, and stock any such waters with sockeye salmon by such methods as it may termine to be most advisable. The Commission shall also have authority to commend to the Governments of the High Contracting Parties removing or erwise overcoming obstructions to the ascent of sockeye salmon, that may w exist or may from time to time occur, in any of the waters covered by this Onvention, where investigation may show such removal of or other action to ercome obstructions to be desirable. The Commission shall make an annual port to the two Governments as to the investigations which it has made and her action which it has taken in execution of the provisions of this Article, of other Articles of this Convention.

The cost of all work done pursuant to the provisions of this Article, or of er Articles of this Convention, including removing or otherwise overcoming structions that may be approved, shall be borne equally by the two Governents, and the said Governments agree to appropriate annually such money as may deem desirable for such work in the light of the reports of the

ommission.

ARTICLE IV

The Commission is hereby empowered to limit or prohibit taking sockeye almon in respect of all or any of the waters described in Article I of this Conention, provided that when any order is adopted by the Commission limiting prohibiting taking sockeye salmon in any of the territorial waters or on the tigh Seas described in paragraph numbered 1 of Article I, such order shall Seas described in paragraph numbered 1 of Article 2, tend to all such territorial waters and High Seas, and, similarly, when in any to all such territorial waters and High Seas, and 2 and 3 of Article I, the Canadian waters embraced in paragraphs numbered 2 and 3 of Article I, Canadian waters embraced in paragraphs numbered 2 and of the order shall extend to all such Canadian waters, and when in any of the aters of the United States of America embraced in paragraph numbered 2 of Tticle I, such order shall extend to all such waters of the United States of the I, such order shall extend to all such waters of the conditions taking sockbe salmon adopted by the Commission shall be construed to suspend or otheraffect the requirements of the laws of the Dominion of Canada or of the tate of Washington as to the procuring of a licence to fish in the waters on their temperatures. Washington as to the procuring of a licence to fish in the waters on their respective territorial waters espective sides of the boundary, or in their respective territorial waters inbraced in paragraph numbered 1 of Article I of this Convention, and proided further that any order adopted by the Commission limiting or probiting taking sockeye salmon on the High Seas embraced in paragraph unbered I of Article I of this Convention shall apply only to nationals and habitants and vessels and boats of the Dominion of Canada and the United

Any order adopted by the Commission limiting or prohibiting taking sockeye almon in the waters covered by this Convention, or any part thereof, shall remain full to some he modified or set aside by the full force and effect unless and until the same be modified or set aside by the ommission. Taking sockeye salmon in said waters in violation of an order of Commission shall be prohibited.
