

- * Fisheries Post-Harvest Technology Program
 - \$8.10 million from CIDA, \$3.25 million from ASEAN;
 - to increase fishery productivity for export and domestic use;
 - with support of Coastal Associates of Newfoundland;

- * ASEAN-Canada Forest Tree Seed Centre (Thailand)
 - \$9.36 million from CIDA, \$2.28 million from Thailand, \$2.87 million from other ASEAN;
 - to increase research and development capacity, provide operational support to reforestation programs, and training and information to forestry personnel and institutions;
 - in association with the Petawawa National Forestry Institute;

- * Canada-ASEAN Regional Training Program (Regional)
 - \$9.1 million from CIDA;
 - to upgrade the capabilities of middle to senior level ASEAN public officials, and strengthen linkages between ASEAN and Canadian individuals and institutions in sectors key to regional development;
 - administered by the Canada-ASEAN Centre;

- * SEAMEO-Canada Cooperation - Phase II (Regional)
 - \$8.0 million from CIDA;
 - to expand the capacities of SEAMEO Regional Centres to deliver human resource development programs and to assist in developing its strategic planning capabilities;
 - SEAMEO will sub-contract with Canadian institutions to be linkage partners with the Regional Centres;

- * Asian Institute of Technology Partnership Program (Thailand)
 - \$14.2 million from CIDA;
 - to train post graduate professionals at the Asian Institute of Technology in urban and rural planning and development, environmental planning, and management;
 - in association with four Canadian Universities headed by the University of Calgary;

- * Ryerson/AIBD Development Broadcasting (Malaysia)
 - \$4.8 million from CIDA;
 - to increase awareness of broadcasters and local organizations of the potential role of broadcasting in the development process through looking at the areas of environment, women's issues, and human settlements;
 - through the partnership of Ryerson International Development Centre and the Asian Institute of Broadcast Development;

- * Asian Institute of Management
 - \$2.3 million from CIDA;
 - to support the training in Women in Management and Gender Analysis and transferring capability to Asian individuals/institutes.
