

Also the mission and strategy use almost the same words, but the strategy calls for the restructuring of government and also increasing the capacity and ability of Indonesians. The agenda and work program I categorize into three major topics: (1) defense, security, politics and social issues; (2) justice, law, human rights and democracy; and (3) also economy and prosperity. I am mentioning all of these agenda items in this program, as I would like to relate these issues to Canadian development assistance policies. I'll give you an example regarding natural resource management and environmental preservation from the SBY-JK agenda. Regarding natural resource management, the agenda is to improve law enforcement and synchronisation of regulations, to create a further incentive and disincentive system, improve interdepartmental coordination, work for the inclusion of local and civil society movements, and the establishment of solid and effective measures of enforcement. Now if we look at CIDA documents, especially the Country Development Program Framework, we find many items, though the most important things are the specific programs, including the urgent reforms of decentralization and also strengthening the effectiveness of risk assessment. If we compare the documents outlining the SBY-JK vision and mission with CIDA's documents, we see that CIDA is on the right track. So, it will be worthwhile for CIDA to continue with these programs, although there are additional some thematic areas that CIDA has focused on, such as improved governance, as seen in programs on fiscal management, consultative processes, and social services, especially regarding the health sector. With regard to civil society, CIDA's programming emphasis is on public capacity in decision making.

The next important thematic points of CIDA's programming, and which also relate to other points of discussion on today's panels, are with sustainable economic opportunities. The framework is intended to help small and medium enterprise development through government policies and support for commercial services, especially for women and small businesses, and as well with regard to renewable energy resource management, emphasizing watershed areas in particular.

Because CIDA's programming has been geographically concentrated on Sulawesi, there have been questions during the consultation period about whether CIDA needs to expand beyond Sulawesi, or whether it is better to be geographically focused in this way. In my opinion it is okay to concentrate on Sulawesi because this
