¹ The figures cited above have been supplied by the organizations concerned and include all ranks. At the junior staff levels, particularly in the stenographic and clerical grades, a relatively large number of the employees are nationals of the country in which the relevant organizations maintain their headquarters and principal offices.

² Canada has paid in full its subscription to the IMF, IBRD and IFC, and was not required, therefore, to make payments in 1965. As to IDA, of the commitment of \$15,027,012 which represents the first instalment of Canada's supplementary contribution to IDA resources, \$13,274,518 was drawn during 1965. A further sum of \$2.5 million was drawn in January 1966.

³ SHAPE is an international military headquarters to which member governments assign personnel, generally from their armed forces, for tours of duty. Most of its staff are thus not employed in the same way that the above organizations employ their personnel.
