Members. My friend, the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans (Mr. Tobin), carefully waited until there was no one from other Parties to rise, and he then rose.

Mr. Blaikie: I was standing.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Blaker): Order, please. There are seconds remaining. If the Hon. Member wishes to make a point of order, I would ask that he do that immediately.

Mr. Simmons: Mr. Speaker, the point is that the Hon. Member for Winnipeg-Birds Hill does not have the right to question the quality of questions put during the ten-minute question period—

Mr. Baker (Nepean-Carleton): But the public does.

Mr. Tobin:—especially when the quality was so high.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Blaker): Order, please. I consider it appropriate for Hon. Members to comment on exchanges that take place during the question and answer period. The Hon. Member for Winnipeg-Birds Hill.

Mr. Blaikie: Mr. Speaker, there is no time left. What happened between those two Liberal Members of Parliament who used up the time in which I had hoped to make some helpful comments is an example of why we have to move these kinds of motions and why the whole bunch on the other side are so corrupt that they are beyond redemption.

Mr. Speaker, I have nothing more to say.

Some Hon. Members: Order.

An Hon. Member: Withdraw or resign.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Blaker): Order, please. The Chair is having some difficulty. I wonder whether the snow storm is responsible for this, but I have to explain to the Hon. Member for Winnipeg-Birds Hill that it is considered to be unparliamentary language to use the word "corrupt". I will give consideration as to whether or not I should make a request that he withdraw it immediately. I think the easier way would be if perhaps the Hon. Member would take another moment and withdraw that word. That would be helpful. Otherwise, in due course, I will have to make a ruling.

Mr. Blaikie: Mr. Speaker, I am not an expert on what constitutes unparliamentary language. But I referred to Members on the other side collectively, as a bunch. I did not refer to the character of any individual Member of Parliament. I stand by my description of the Liberal Party and its Government.

Mr. Baker (Nepean-Carleton): That is not unparliamentary.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Blaker): May I point out to Hon. Members that by an order made earlier the House is now expected to consider the question before it. Is the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans rising to contribute to a point of order on the word "corrupt"?

Mr. Tobin: No, Mr. Speaker.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Blaker): In that case, I thank the Hon. Member. I believe we should proceed as follows. Over the evening and tomorrow, I will consider the use of the word, and I will take counsel in that regard. It is possible that other Hon. Members may wish to contribute. I would suggest that that be done tomorrow. At this point I ought to put the question before the House. Accordingly, it being 5.45 p.m. it is my duty pursuant to Standing Order 62(10), to interrupt the proceedings and put forthwith every question necessary to dispose of the business of Supply.

Is it the pleasure of the House to adopt the motion?

Some Hon. Members: Agreed.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Blaker): All those in favour of the motion please say yea.

Some Hon. Members: Yea.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Blaker): All those opposed to the motion please say nay.

Some Hon. Members: Nay.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Blaker): In my opinion the nays have it.
