....In a prefatory letter to a work of Mr. Charles Darwin's, recently published, he says:

"It seems to me absurd to doubt that a man may be an ardent theist and an evolutionist. . . . What my own views may be is a question of no consequence to any one but myself. But, as you ask, I may state that my judgment often fluctuates. Moreover, whether a man deserves to be called a theist depends [on the definition of the term, which is much too large a subject for a note. In my most extreme fluctuations I have never been an atheist in the sense of denying the existence of a God. I think that generally
