

C. P. R. Off Two Points--Mining Issues Irregular--Jupiter 54 1/2

EXPORT DEMAND
ADVANCES WHEATPolitical Outlook in Europe
Also Aids in Upward
Movement.

CHICAGO, April 7.—Export talk and the disturbed political situation in Europe offset a number of bearish features to-day and gave a strong tone to wheat, May reaching 33c, the highest for more than a month. The net result was an advance for wheat of 1/4c to 1 1/2c, for corn 1/4c to 1 1/2c and for oats 1/4c to 1/2c, but provisions finished at a net decline of a shade to 25c.

Baltimore was reported in the market for No. 2 hard winter wheat and it was reported that export sales at the close of last week amounted to 100,000 bushels. Strong foreign markets helped stiffen this one and appreciation because of the clash between Montenegro and the powers gave strength to the rest of the wheat market. May corn made a new high mark for the season when it sold a shade under 26c. An improved demand for wheat and prospects of further delays in shipments from the interior were the uplifting factors. Oats showed strength in sympathy with corn.

Selling pressure on pork weakened the entire provision list.
