Expulsion. ART. 7. Any Member may be expelled for persisting in breach of, or non compliance with the Rules, Bye Laws and Resolves of the Society; Provided that such expulsion be by four fifths of the Members present, and that the question on such expulsion be not put till the next meeting after it may have been proposed, and that the Member so proposed to be expelled have had notice of the cause of his intended expulsion. It is however understood that during the meetings it shall be the duty of the President to preserve decorum, and any person may be expelled immediately, for persisting in a breach thereof, or for repeated breaches of the same:

Amendments to the Rules.

ART. 8. None of these Rules shall be abrogated altered or amended by less than a majority of four fifths of the Members present; and any motion to that effect shall have been before the

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
