Binghamton Suffer a White-wash in First Game of the Series.

A gale was blowing out from the east, and Whitey drove the ball right into the teeth of this hummer and landed it up in the bleacher. He also grabbed off a single during the afternoon.

The visitors failed to show much. Warhop's grand box work made them look like an ordinary team, and the underhand finger was never in any serious trouble. The five hits were piled off at widely-scattered intervals.
