United States food administrator, today gave out a statement on the food situation in Europe, in which he says in part: "Since my arrival in Europe I have been co-operating with the officials of the allied governments in an investigation of the food situation, more particularly in the liberated regions. We have made some investigation of conditions in Germany, but are not yet prepared to come to any definite conclusions.

"The population of Germany certainly has enough stocks of food to carry on for a while, with the exception of fat supplies, which are undoubtedly very short and are developing some condition of disease and a great deal of social discontent.
