Cologne, April 13 .- The Sofia correspondent of The Cologne Gazette telegraphs that M. Sarafoff, President of the Macedonian Committee, has issued a proclamation, calling to arms all Macedonians resident in Bulgaria. The proclamation fixes the rising for the Greek Church Easter, on April 27 and

The Macedonians are ordered to re-Dubnitza and Kustendje, and be pre-pared to invade Macedonia simultaneously from different points. Large parties of Macedonians are journeying daily toward the frontier.
