QUERIES REGARDING MILITARY SERVICE

Send in Your Problems and They Will Be Answered From Official Information by The Advertiser.

Question .- I went to the United States and took out my first papers and swore allegiance to that coun-try. Later I returned to Canada, and have remained here the greater part of my time, but I have not re-newed my Canadian citizenship. 1. Am I a Canadian citizen?

2. Is my son, born since my re-turn, a Canadian and eligible to military draft? T. L. F.

Answer.—1. The legal point raised is involved. If you are sure that you have renounced allegiance to the Brit-ish Empire and pledged it to the United States, it would be reasonably certain that you are no longer a Canadian. The place of residence makes no dif-ference

2. If your son was born after you became a citizen of the United States he is also a citizen of the United States and, therefore, not liable for service here.
