CONVULSIONS SEIZE SOLDIER AT PORT: RUSHED TO HOSPITAL

Nearly a dozen emergency cases were handled Saturday by the nurses of No. 4 Nursing Division, St. John Ambulance Brigade, at Port Stanley, according to reports received by the

headquarters here. Of the three serious cases treated, one was that of a soldier who was brought to the emergency station at 'Port" in an unconscious state, and who took convulsion after convulsion while there. Three doctors were required before the soldier was finally put on a train on a stretcher, and, ir charge of one of the A.M.C. boys, sent to the London Military Hospital. The ambulance was secured by telephone and met the train on arrival here.

Another serious case was that of a Detroit boy, who fell down the hill and was brought in unconscious. His head and shoulder were injured. He also was sent to London as soon as he was able to be moved.


During Saturday morning a woman who fell was brought in, and remained unconscious two hours. She was finally able to go home.


