HAMILTON, Feb. 26.-(Special.)-The special power committee met this afternoon and appointed T. W. Sothman to draw up the specifications for the proposed municipal street lighting and power plant. His price was \$2000 and he got the job, altho other firms quoted lower prices. Ald.
