CELLULOID EXPLOSION

Sheppard-Street Factory Building Scorched and Damage of \$60,000 is Done.

Fire which started from friction in an engine in the premises of Smith & D'Entremont, 18 and 20 Sheppardstreet, exploded a great quantity of celluloid at 7.40 o'clock yesterday morning. The whole building of four storeys was rapidly enveloped in flame and the hundred workers employed by this and other firms were driven to hasty flight.

The fire spread to Nos. 16, 22, 24, 26, 23 and 30 before it was drowned out by the firemen, who responded from almost every station in the city to the several alarms sent out. Many of the smaller firms were hit

for whatever damage they sustained owing to the high rate of insurance, making policies scarce in the block. The blaze was handled ably under the direction of Chief Thompson and Deputy Chief Noble. When the Baystreet sections, a block away, arrived, the flames were belching almost across the street, and Bond's livery stable

the street, and Bond's livery stable was igniting. It was only by determined bucking against great heat and beastly smoke that the firemen were able to confine the fire as well as they did. The block has been scorched two or three times before.

Deputy Chief Noble was away the first to arrive and was told that twenty persons were still in the building. With a couple of firemen he hurried to the rear and found it, as well as the front of the building, in flames. Then he was told that all employes were safe. Ladders were erected to protect Jones Brothers' premises, but while the deputy was away some one ordered the section down, as it had been said that the floors were heavily weighted and might collapse.


