Private Bills Are Considered—Liability for Natural Gas Explosion Damages.

The order paper in the legislature was cleaned of several private bills yesterday afternoon which received an unopposed second reading, but with-out the house committing itself to their adoption. Premier Whitney gave a warning to members that they must be ready to take up the remainder of the private bills next Wednesday if they wished them to be proceeded with this session.

The premier also pointed out that all bills for amendments to the assessment act must go to the special committee, which will sit during the recess. The amendments they contain will be treated as suggestions, but the committee will not be confined to the suggestions in the bills.

Mr. S. Brewster, South Brant, moved the second reading of his bill to make fire insurance companies liable for damages caused by natural gas explosions. Some insurance companies paid the losses as a matter of grace, while others did not. At present people did not know if their policies covered loss caused by such explosions. The bill was to make this clear.

Hon. J. J. Foy said the bill could go to the legal committee, where the insurance companies could be heard. It appeared to be adding an additional risk, in which case there would be no doubt an increase in the insurance rates.
