Canada is slowly awaking to the significance of the subject.

Five years ago Mr. W. J. Gage, of Toronto, decided to devote \$25,000 to the work.

It was first proposed to start an institution in or near Toronto.

The attempt to enlist the co-operation of the Municipality failed.

The late Mr. H. A. Massey, however, became interested and offered to add another \$25,000.

The medical authorities consulted reported against the suitability of Toronto as a site, recommending Muskoka in preference.

Accordingly a splendid site was finally chosen near Gravenhurst.
