# **Would Take Over** Street Railway

Strongly disapproving the agreements existing between the city and the St. John Railway Company for the upkeep and maintenance of the streets, Commissioner G. Fred. Fisher, of the public works department, advocated the acquiring of the property by the city of St. John, in his annual report, which was submitted to the common council yesterday afternoon. The commissioner also drew attention to the fact there is a possibility of a law suit between the city and the company to recover payment for work, amounting to \$464, said to have been done on the street railway tracks in Main street. It was brought out in the report that the legislature has looked after the interests of the city better in its dealings with the company than the city itself.
