Cleaver Canadian Jockey. Toronto, Sept. 7—Jockey J. Bell, one of the best lightweight riders developed in Canada in recent years, has joined the stable of W. S. Kilmer trained by Henry McDaniel. He commenced riding on rather galloping horses, for Harry Giddings, Jr., three years ago, his first experience with horses. He showed ability from the outset, but did not ride his first winner, Jack, until the June meeting at Connaught Park last year. The last's riding has been mostly confined to the Giddings horses, but he piloted seven winners last year, and fourteen during the short Canadian season recently closed. Bell's relatives reside at Newcastle, England. He is sixteen years of age, and can ride at ninety-four pounds. He went to the Kilmer stable on trial during the meeting of Saratoga, but the sale of his contract by Mr. Giddings to the Kilmer stable was only completed yesterday.

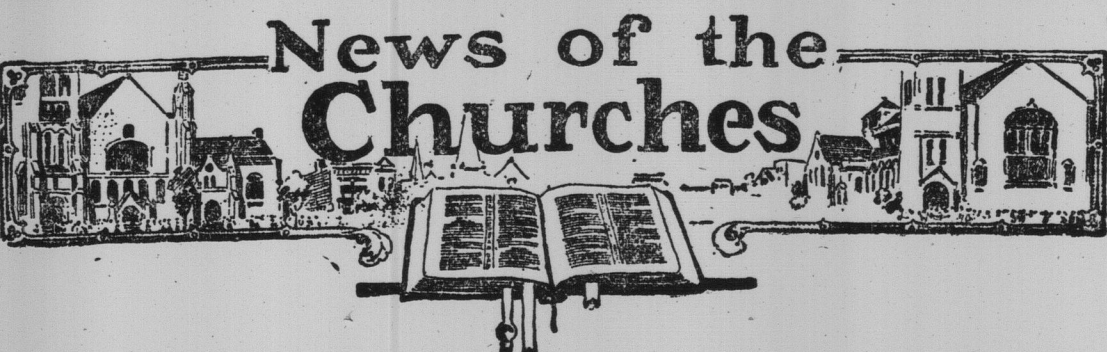

## Sent All of Her 10 Sons To War

The Record of Patriotic English Woman's Family a Proud One

Nineteen years ago the London Daily Mail told the story of Mrs. Smith of the village of Attleborough, fourteen miles from Norwich, who, like the mother of the Gracchi, dedicated her sons to her country. There were ten of them alive then; six were in the army and four more were joining. One of the patriotic ten, A. C. Smith, now writes from Norwich giving the military record of himself and his family. Mr. and Mrs. Smith senior are still alive and well, and live at Bunwell.

Charles William Smith (eldest son), lieutenant and quartermaster, served twenty-eight years—now at home injured.

Sidney George, color sergeant in Norfolk—died after serving nineteen years. Percival, with twelve years' service and two medals—now with East African forces.

Ernest (fourteen years' service), a lieutenant and quartermaster—fighting in France.

Reginald Arnold (twelve years' service)—killed in Egypt last year.

Albert Cyril (seventeen and one-half years' service)—invalided home and doing recruiting work.
