\$20 CATTLE RATE LOWEST FEASIBLE ON DOMINION SHIPS

Merchant Marine Can't Go
in Trade For Less Teakle
Tells Committee

OTTAWA, May 28.—The Canadian Government Merchant Marine cannot profitably go into the cattle carrying business at less than the \$20 rate. This statement was made positively by R. B. Teakle, head of the line, at today's meeting of the Commons committee on National Railways.

FAILS TO SEE PROFIT.

Several members of the committee were anxious to know what could be done if parliament ordered the equipment of some of the nationally owned ships at federal cost. Mr. Teakle did not think, even with the initial cost of equipment left out of the balance sheet, that the cattle cargoes would return a profit for the line. There was no assurance of continuous full cargoes and ships equipped for cattle only would have to sail with less than capacity loads. Last year the boats set aside for cattle got very little business. This year they were fully booked until the middle of July, however.

During the winter, the Merchant Marine had carried from Saint John about 500 head in eleven sailings from that port. A company which tried to carry cattle at cut rates had gone into

Boat Aground, Party Saved At Grand Manan

GRAND MANAN, May 28.—An accident that might have had serious consequences occurred off the Nantuxet shore on Wednesday. A boat from North Head carrying Liquor Inspector Dennis Gupitt ran onto the Pirate Weir and was badly damaged, rapidly filling with water. Passengers in the boat were a woman and several other men. The party signalled ashore by waving their coats and the message of distress was telephoned to North Head. In response Harley Ingersoll put out in his boat from Long Island and Warren Ingersoll took a boat from Woodward's Cove and rushed to the rescue. The damaged boat was released in time to prevent more serious consequences.

They instituted an apprentice system and now at least 80 per cent of the officers were Canadians, many of them trained on Government ships. 21 Who Failed Normal
School Exams to Try
Again

HALIFAX, May 28.—The twenty-one graduates of Mount Allison, Dalhousie and St. Francis Xavier universities who failed to pass the minimum professional qualification examinations to admit them to the Provincial Normal College short course, will have another chance, according to an agreement reached today between the Principal, Dr. David Sloan and the Nova Scotia Council of Public Instruction, which is the executive council of the government. The intermediary was Dr. A. H. Mackay, Superintendent of Education, who was in Ottawa when the situation arose and returned yesterday.

The candidates who failed claimed that the examinations had been unfair in that they had not been warned of the subjects upon which they would be called upon to write.

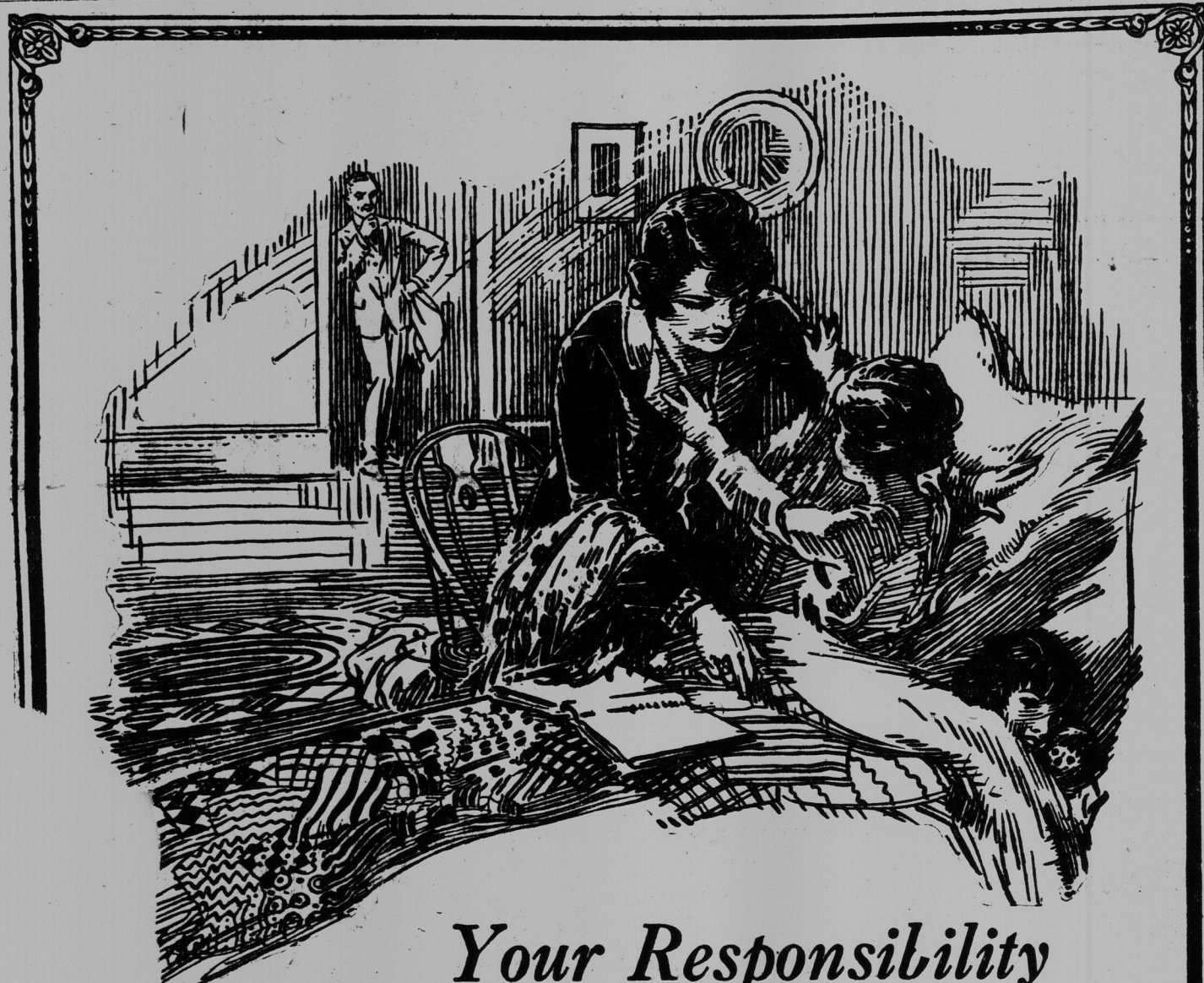
Grey Opposes Lloyd George In Party Row

LONDON, May 28.—Viscount Grey added another sensation to the Liberal party dispute today by announcing that he stands with Lord Oxford and Asquith in the controversy between the latter and Mr. Lloyd George. Speaking at a luncheon at the National Liberal Club, Lord Grey said: "I stand entirely with and behind Lord Oxford. . . . If there have been difficulties inside the Liberal party, they are not difficulties of his making. Those of us who have been closely associated with him feel that the surprise is not that something should have appeared now but that it has been so long delayed."
