Churchill is Vexed Over Action Relative to Cruiser Programme

LONDON IS CONTENT WITH GERMAN NOTE

Air Ministry Maturing Plans for Airplane Service to India.

LONDON, July 30.—The cabinet crisis over the Admiralty's cruiser programme was not a little accentuated by the definite hostility in some Conservative quarters towards the Chancellor of the Exchequer, and still further by the fact that the Chancellor of the Exchequer's main champions in the cabinet happened, fortuitously or otherwise, to be prominent members of the old coalition cabinet. In all parties these old political feuds are extraordinarily tenacious. Mr. Churchill's fight against the Sea Lords was handicapped by the fact that resignation on his part might have been súicidal, owing to his peculiar parliamentary record, whereas the Sea Lords, notably Earl Beatty, the First Sea Lord, with only a few months to run, were in a strong position to threaten the cabinet with a first class sensation.
