

### PREPARE FOR Y. M. C. A. DRIVE

Canvassers at Supper Hear  
Fine Address from Gen-  
eral Secretary of Dominion  
Council.

The canvassers engaged in the Y. M. C. A. drive for money being carried on in the city met last evening in the Association building for supper. They were addressed by Harry Ballantyne, general secretary of the Y. M. C. A. of Canada. R. S. Stephenson, president of the Y. M. C. A. of St. John, presided. The supper was served by members of the Ladies' Auxiliary under the leadership of Mrs. G. Wilford Campbell. Mr. Ballantyne spoke on the great need the association had for money to carry on its work, especially in view of the tightness of money at present.

The Y. M. C. A. in Canada had 80,000 members, 18,000 of whom were boys. There were 25,000 men and boys in gymnasium classes and 8,000 young men in evening educational classes. Help in securing employment had been given to 2,600; 2,000 men lived in the buildings, 7,000 belonged to Bible classes and 162,000 had attended religious meetings and Bible classes. Social events for the year numbered 2,600.

The Y. M. C. A. had four primary functions, the speaker said, physical, social, educational and religious. The physical work was undertaken not to make experts in games, though this was done incidentally, but to fit men to be as efficient as possible. The social side was surrounded with the best possible atmosphere, preferable to that often found in other places. The educational classes were the school of the second chance for those who had not had advantages in early life. The religious work was not in opposition to that of the churches, but supplementary to it.

The public must be made to understand just what the Y. M. C. A. really was, he said. Many people thought of it as a building. This was not the case; the building was merely the tool, the Y. M. C. A. was an idea, a programme, with relation to men and boys.

In a canvass, such as was being carried on there were several requisites, a good organization, good methods, good spirit, a good cause. The banquet had been well attended and he believed the workers had shown themselves willing to co-operate and enthusiastic for the work. He thought that the body of men secured was equal to any he had met anywhere.

F. T. Barbour, president of the organization, and L. P. D. Tilley, K.C., and George L. Warwick, former presidents, spoke briefly, and the function came to a close with prayer by W. C. Cross, also a former president.

### PAINTING TOOK 20 YEARS TO FINISH

Huge Canvas of Hungarian,  
Izzo Kovacs, to be Shown  
in New York.

New York, March 14.—A single canvas 18 by 12 feet, representing twenty years of work by the Hungarian painter Izzo Kovacs, has been discovered, after its loss during the war, and brought to this country, where it will be exhibited at the Anderson Galleries next Monday.

The picture is called "Judea Capta, or the Triumph of Titus," and shows the celebration in Rome over the capture of Jerusalem. It has been praised by European critics and was brought here by Arthur Lassow of 218 East Sixtieth street, a pupil of Kovacs.

Mr. Lassow recently found the picture on which his master had spent the greater part of his life in a cellar in Budapest. Kovacs was considered by his contemporaries in Hungary as a great painter and was honored by the late Emperor Franz Josef. When he had completed his enormous canvas of the capture of Jerusalem, he was ordered to leave the country and to establish himself elsewhere.

It was reported that the government expected to buy it for the public and show it in this country, maintained constant correspondence with Kovacs, and was interrupted by the war. When Lassow sought to re-establish himself after the war he learned that Kovacs had died, almost in poverty, and that his painting had been hidden away.

"Thinking only to restore the work to the world, Mr. Lassow went in vain to Budapest to search for the canvas, and ultimately found it, held for rental charges. Some difficulty was encountered in taking the picture out of the country, Mr. Lassow said, as the government made objections, but they were overcome and the canvas was brought to the United States.

The picture shows the Roman forum at the hour of Titus' triumph, with enslaved Jewish maidens in the foreground leading the procession. Close behind them is carried the loot of the Temple, the Ark, the candelabra, and the vessels of the sacrifice. On either side of the procession people of Rome are crowded, jeering and shouting at the captives.

### Prohibition and Grand Falls Development

(Continued From Page 2.)

The prohibitionists were at the present time agitating the governments of the Dominion. Recently a conference on the subject had been held at St. John, but the delegates had been very cautious over accepting the responsibility of bringing in immigrants. His own opinion was that immigrants should not be brought into the province unless they were of a class who would prove a benefit. He would rather spend the money in an effort to encourage the native young men to remain in the province.

Referring to the question of prohibition, he said that the honorable leader of the Farmers' party had made a statement, which he thought he had put in writing. His prohibition principles had got to be a joke that reminded him of the past might cause him to forget he was a prohibitionist. He (Veniot) did not pretend to be a prohibitionist, nor was he an apostle of prohibition.

He was not afraid to say that because he was a hypocrite. He wanted it understood, however, that he was a believer in the law; he had prohibition on the statute books and he was not going to enforce it. He had promised to enforce the law and he would make the effort and be the judge. If after having made the effort he was convinced that the law could not be enforced, and the fault was in the law, he would go before the Temperance Alliance and the temperance people and submit something which he believed would be an improvement. If a new law should be submitted to him, he would put into force it. He had issued instructions to certain inspectors and had asked for certain reports and had received them all.

He then referred to the statement by Police Magistrate Ritchie, reflecting upon Chief Inspector Hawthorne, and said that he had asked the Chief Inspector to resign. The Chief Inspector had threatened the Police Magistrate with legal proceedings with a result that he eventually took back his statement.

The Premier went on to say that he had positive proof that the law has not been violated by the liquor exporters. If he could be shown that the contrary was the case, the warehouses would quickly disappear from St. John. He said the Government to have a fair chance, and did not think that they should be asked to deal with rummers. He was satisfied that illicit liquors were being smuggled into the province, and in this connection he pointed out that 150 stills had been seized in the province in the last year. The Government could enforce the law so far as vendors were concerned, but illicit stills came under the scope of the Federal Government.

Mr. Veniot speaking particularly about the leader of the Farmer party, said that he was no more a farmer than he (Veniot) was, but a middleman. He said that one of the sellers of fertilizer who had aided in placing the farmer in the position in which he was, he thought it was time the public knew that.

The criticism of the honorable leader of the official Opposition (Richards) had been just. His quoting of incorrect figures had been most noticeable in his discussion of the highways, the financial position of the Musquash and the extension of the federal aid for highway construction and hoped that the Government would be able to pass a bill which would be a benefit to the province.

The total expenditure on all hydro-electric development, including the Bathurst line, totalled \$2,700,000. He had been very pleased to give such figures as against a removal of the University of New Brunswick from the province to Halifax. Before the end of the session he hoped to be able to announce that the Government had decided to remove the University to the province.

Touching on the matter of Grand Falls in the development, he said that the Government had decided to purchase the franchise after May 1, and the day was past when companies could be organized before the decision of the government development at Grand Falls could be made there must be assurance of the Government safeguarding of the public interests.
