### CLAIM AGAINST CITY IN NEWMAN BROOK EXPLOSION

Chas. Donald Asks for \$1,000 Damages—Housing Board Balance Cancelled—C. P. R. Boring in Lombard St.

According to a letter received by the city and read at this morning's committee meeting of the common council, the executive council of the province at a recent meeting decided to cancel the unpaid balance allowed to the city of St. John under the housing act.

G. H. V. Belyea wrote a letter to the council enclosing a claim from Charles Donald, amounting to \$1,000 for damage done to his house by the explosion at Newman Brook. The letter was referred to Commissioner Jones and the city solicitor.

A letter was read from J. A. Barry, advising that a car load of the 8, 10 and 12 inch pipe which he offered to sell to the city was at Reid's Point siding and was open for inspection.

### IMPORTANT TRAIN CHANGES

C. P. R. Makes Announcement of Interest to People Who Travel.

The C. P. R. passenger department this morning announced that some changes would be effective in this district on and after June 26.

Commencing on June 27 the through train to Boston will be resumed, the service leaving here at 1:20 (day-light time) and will return from Welsford arriving in the city at 4:25 p. m.

On the Aroostook branch between Aroostook and Presque Isle the mixed train in each direction has been cancelled, and on the Edmondston and division between Aroostook and Edmondston.

Suburbanites are informed that No. 99 the second train going to Montreal will stop at Welsford if flagged for passengers going to Megantic or west.

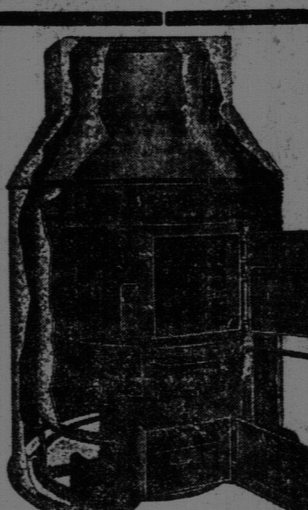

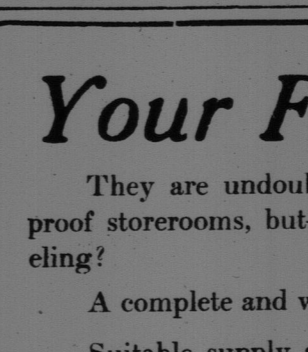
