SUICIDE FOLLOWS ON RESTIGOUCHE MURDER

Settler Kills Lumber Operator, Seriously Wounds Another, Ends Own Life

The woods in the vicinity of Anderson, a small settlement in the northwoods, along the International railway, and some miles from Campbellton, were the scene of a terrible tragedy on Saturday in which Peter Rixon, a settler, shot and killed Elvin Annett, a lumber foreman, seriously wounded John Glover, a lumber operator, and then killed himself with a shot from his rifle.

The reason given for the fearful happenings is that Rixon was under the impression that the men were cutting logs on his property. The murder was premeditated and done deliberately. Rixon followed Annett to the woods and shot at him from ambush, killing him on the second shot. He then went to where Glover was at work and fired at him, but did not make a clean shot, so that the man may possibly recover.

Rixon went further into the woods and when a posse under Chief of Police Hughes followed him to the woods and shot at him from the hospital, while the dead body of Annett was taken care of by Undertaker Graham. A. E. McKenzie, a former St. John man, is believed to be the coroner's party to the scene of the crime.

RECENT DEATHS

The death of Mrs. Sarah Webb, widow of Thomas Webb, took place yesterday at the residence of her brother-in-law, James Whelby, Silver Falls. The funeral will take place on Tuesday morning at a quarter to ten. Requiem high mass will be celebrated in St. Joachim's church at ten o'clock.

Pemberton, N. B., Nov. 10.—(Special)—C. R. Palmer, who for many years was general storekeeper of the I. C. R., at Moncton, died here at 7:30 o'clock yesterday after a brief illness. He was in the 78th year of his age and came here from Moncton in 1908. He was a native of New Brunswick. His wife was Miss Agnes Murray, of Kings county. There are no children, but one brother and two sisters survive.

Many friends in the city and county will learn with regret the death of Mrs. Rachel Vaughan Rourke, wife of W. H. Rourke, which took place at St. Martin's hospital, St. John, N. B., yesterday. Mrs. Rourke was 73 years of age and besides her husband is survived by two sons, Charles, of New York, and Edward, of Kildare, Ireland. She was the daughter, Mrs. F. W. MacLean, of Kings county. There are no children, but one brother and two sisters survive.

William Thomson & Co. received a cablegram announcing the death yesterday in England of Lord Furness, head of the Furness line of steamers. Lord Furness was born at West Hartlepool April 23, 1832. He was the seventh son of the late John Furness and Averil, daughter of John Wilson, late of Vanebo Hall, Co. Durham. He was married in 1876 to Jane Annet, only daughter of Henry Suggett, of Brierley. He was educated privately. He resided in York City in 1888. He owned more than 30,000 acres of land in England and took a deep interest in road building, golfing and motoring. He was an M. P. for Hartlepool 1891-1895 and since 1900.
