Ottawa, July 20—Canada's total trade for the twelve months ending April 30, 1913, as published in a bulletin by the department of trade and commerce, was \$1,079,984,018, a splendid increase compared with the corresponding period last year, when the total was \$879,611,888. The total imports were \$678,587,617; exports were \$401,396,401. The amount of duty collected was \$115,641,977. One of the most interesting items in the list of imports is settlers' effects brought in by immigrants. During the twelve months ended April 30, this year, the value of these from the United States was \$1,029,295 as compared with \$4,000,274 from Great Britain. The figures show in a comprehensive way the striking increases in the imports and exports which have already been reflected in monthly reports. A noteworthy feature is the increase of imports from the United States. Imports from that country during the twelve months were valued at \$442,218,848, an increase over the preceding period of over \$75,000,000 or about 18 per cent, and of more than 100 per cent over the twelve months which ended with April, 1910. The total British imports for the year ending with April, 1913, also showed a satisfactory increase, being \$140,178,841, nearly \$20,000,000 or 17 per cent, increase over the preceding period. Exports also show a satisfactory increase in the report. For the twelve months to the end of April, 1913, the total was \$401,396,401. For the corresponding period of the previous year it was \$818,919,880. For 1913 the exports to the United Kingdom were \$188,794,820. The United States they were \$168,603,800. Meighen Unopposed. Portage La Prairie, Man., July 19.—Arthur Meighen, the new solicitor general, was today returned unopposed for the Portage La Prairie constituency after today's nomination call had resulted in no other name being put forward, so that the returning officer announced Mr. Meighen duly elected.
