(Canadian Press) - Washington, Mar. 15 - Republican opponents of Canadian reciprocity are disappointed at the decision of the house Democrats to pass the agreement without taking any tariff measures to it.

Under the last day of two, Chairman Underwood has caused it to be known that the reciprocity agreement would be reported to the form in which it was submitted to congress at the recent session.

The meeting was held in favor of reciprocity with Canada. A resolution providing for the sending of a letter to President Taft endorsing him for his position in that regard was passed without opposition.
