Athletic Acadia Wins

Halifax, May 26.—Acadia won first honors in the intercollegiate track meet against Mount Allison and the University of New Brunswick today. The events were all keenly contested. No records were broken, but Binney, of the University of N. B., equalled the 100 yard dash record—10.25 seconds.

Acadia scored 47 points, the University of N. B. 35, and Mount Allison 18. Howe, of the University of New Brunswick, scored 12 points. The silver cup goes to Acadia. It will have to be won five times before it becomes the permanent property of any college.

The results were:— 100 yards dash—won by Binney of U. N. B. time 10.45 seconds. Running high jump—won by Andrews of Acadia; height 5 feet 5 inches.

Running broad jump—won by Andrews of Acadia; 20 feet 2 1/2 inches. 220 yards dash—won by Robinson of Acadia; time 23.55 seconds.

Shot put—won by Ellich of Acadia; 25 feet 1 inch. Hammer throw—won by Cochran of Acadia; 113 feet, 1 inch.

440 yards dash—won by Robinson of Acadia; 54.34 seconds. 120 yard hurdles—won by Porter of Acadia; time 17.85 seconds.

One mile run—won by Richmond of Acadia; time 4 minutes 42 seconds. Acadia scored 47 points; U. N. B. 35, and Mount Allison 18.

100 yards dash, final—1st, Binney, U. N. B.; 2nd, McKay, Mount Allison; 3rd, Robinson, Acadia. Time, 10.25 seconds. Running broad jump—1st, Andrews, Acadia; 2nd, Porter, Acadia; 3rd, Binney, U. N. B.
