Alexandra Ladies' College we conceive to be worthy of your patronage. Here your daughters will find ample opportunities for a finished education. The Canada Christian Advocate, our Church organ, we recommend to your faithful notice. Let it be found in your homes, to give you information concerning the Church, and wholesome reading for your families. Let us be loyal to our Church, and faithful to our profession.

Let all the graces of the Spirit find an embodiment in your lives and experience. Our Conference has been one of harmony and sweet counsel. We have labored in all things to advance the Redeemer's Kingdom, and trust that the ministry sent to your respective fields of labor will meet with a kind reception. They will doubtless come to you in the name and fear of the Lord. Co-operate with them; cheer and encourage them in their toils. The blessings of the Triune God rest upon you all, and the labors

of this Conference year.
