You see, the surveys for this motor highway, winding from the picturesque town of Revelstoke down in the valley, up and up the steep sides of the mighty Mount Revelstoke, until at last it would lose itself in the beauties of the mountain to particularly above the clouds, were started to away back in 1912, and this wonder away back in 1912, and this wonder hand of Nature would have been thrown open to the world long ago, but for the outbreak of the war.

All work on the new highway was, perforce, stopped for a short time, but in 1915 Prince Arthur of Connaught drove over the portion then completed and planted a stone at what was then the end of construction. The following year, his father, the Duke of Connaught, who was then Governor-General of Canada, accompanied by Princess Patricia, drove as far up the highway as was then possible, and once more the end of construction was marked by a royal stone. Still later, in 1927, the Prince of Wales was able to drive app the highway for sixteen miles.

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
