AN ONTARIO CITY.

It is frequently charged, and with justice, that the people of the western provinces do not know as much as they should about the maritime provinces.

At it is no less true that our own people have only a limited knowledge of the greatness of the western country—even of Ontario.

This thought is suggested to the Star by the receipt from the mayor and council of Brantford of an illustrated souvenir number of the Brantford Express, issued in commemoration of the city's quarter-centennial.

It was not until 1830 that the Indians surrendered their right to the territory. The first white settler had gone there in 1815, and in 1840 the town of Brantford was incorporated.

The twenty-four handsomely and profusely illustrated pages of the special issue of the Express tell the story of Brantford, past and present; and after one has glanced over them, took note of what the city of today is and what it possesses, there is some difficulty in realizing that so much has been accomplished by a city whose population today is only 17,000.

It has 50 miles of good streets, a sewerage system that cost \$155,000; sidewalks, \$200,000; water supply, \$322,000; school buildings, \$138,350, with annual expenditure of \$39,400; and fire fighting plant and station, \$23,163, with an annual appropriation of \$3,400.

There are both electricity and gas for lighting purposes. There is also an excellent street railway system. The assessment valuation of the city, which in 1877 was \$3,358,610, was last year \$7,480,400, although it is stated that \$1,974,100 of this is really exempt from taxation.

The exports of Brantford last year amounted to \$982,346, and the imports to \$1,531,025. Of the exports, \$372,114 worth went to Great Britain; \$310,053 to Australia, \$100,365 to France, \$90,018 to Germany, \$74,898 to United States, \$10,921 to Argentina, \$7,891 to Chili, \$8,660 to Holland, and lesser values to Newfoundland, South Africa, Denmark, Mexico, Porto Rico, West Indies and even to Russia.
