THE ODDFELLOWS ARE NEARING CENTURY MARK

Ninety-third Anniversary of Organization Takes Form of Dinner to Hon. J. V. Ellis—Local Lodges Turn Out in Force in His Honor—Good Work for the Destitute Done by the Grand Lodge.

The ninety-third anniversary of the founding of the Independent Order of Oddfellows was celebrated last evening when the festal took the form of a complimentary dinner to the Hon. J. V. Ellis, P. G. A. A strong representation of the five lodges in the city attended the dinner, which was held in Bond's restaurant, and which proved to be one of the most enjoyable functions that this order has held for some years. The menu was handsomely gotten up, the general color being green and drab with a photograph of the guest of the evening on the front cover.

District Deputy Grand Master Frank Griffith presided, and after the substantial array of good things had been done justice to the toast to the King was given by toastmaster R. B. Emmerson and rendered the usual musical honors by Hedley V. McKinnon, who acted as accompanist. The toast "Canada" was then given, and responded to by W. F. Hatheway, M. P. P. G. and John E. Wilson, M. P. P. Both of these gentlemen in their addresses spoke of the great strides which Canada has made in the past toward prosperity, and of the future greatness that is in store for her. In closing their speeches both of them remarked on the beauty of Canadian scenery which, they said, could not be surpassed.

As a fitting token of loyalty to this great country Wm. Lawton, P. G., was called on to render "O Canada." The toast to the City of St. John was then proposed. His Worship Mayor Frink responded and during the course of his address he spoke of the conditions in this city during the past few years, and said it was only during the last fifteen years that St. John had been going ahead.

Continuing his Worship said the making of this city, the winter port of Canada, had caused the first forward movement, which had culminated in the present bright state of affairs, and that undoubtedly this city would soon be ranked among the largest ports of the world.

Speaking of the old form of civic government, Mayor Frink said although many disparaging statements had been made about it, they were not justified, as the aldermen had labored under the great drawback of not having enough time to transact the civic business properly, but now that the commission plan of government had come into force the affairs of the city could be handled in a more satisfactory manner.

The toast to the Grand Lodge was proposed by the toastmaster and responded to by Dr. A. D. Smith, who in his address spoke on the greatness of the order and of the good work which had been carried out during the past year. The speaker stated that the sum of \$6,000,000 had been spent in the upkeep of destitute women and children and that many other kind deeds had been done. In response to the expressed wish of His Worship the Mayor to be reinstated in the lodge, Dr. Smith stated that the members would be only too glad to see him among them again.
