Sofia, July 3.—King Ferdinand received Premier Danoff M. Theodroff, Minister of Finance, and all the partyleaders, in a prolonged audience this afternoon. The government has sent an energetic protest to Athens against the treatment to which the Bulgarian troops have been subjected at Saloniki, demanding the immediate liberation of Bulgarian soldiers deported to Greece and the restoration of their arms.

Bulgaria demands also that conditions which obtained at Saloniki prior to the present rupture be restored and that the Bulgarian garrison be reinstalled and the Bulgarian flag hoisted with due honors.
