QUEBEC FIRE
Quebec, July 31.—The workshops of
the Quebec Railway L. and P. Com-
pany at St. Anne de Beauport were
practically destroyed by fire last night.
The blaze broke out in the old shop
and spread to the round house, which
was also destroyed. Three freight cars
and a passenger car were burned com-
pletely to their trucks.
The reflection of the blaze could be
plainly seen in Quebec city, twenty-
one miles from the scene of the fire.
