THE LEGISLATURE.

STURDAY'S PROCEEDINGS. Fredericton, March 30. The following Bills were introduced: Waddell's, a Bill to incorporate an industrial school of St. John, and a petition in favor of the Bill; and a Bill to incorporate St. Andrew's Society Curling Club. Stevenson, a Bill to incorporate the N. B. and Canada Railway Company; and Napier a Bill to incorporate Napier and Flemming Railway Company; but as this last was only a little and no bill, it was withdrawn.

The House went into Committee on Wednesday's Bill to enable executors to issue on judgments obtained in the County of Compton. Prior to the passage of County Court Act.

After some discussion, the Bill was agreed to. The Secretary laid before the House a report on the St. Stephen Bank, which was read and went on to deliver a speech on our financial position. In showing how certain matters might be remedied he got into a dispute with Kelly, who stated that the chairman of the Committee at present investigating the reports of the Chief Commissioner of Public Works and the Crown Lands report (namely, Gough) went into the Reporters' Gallery before the committee had got through with one evidence, and stated that the committee were ending damaging revelations, and Kelly further stated that the statements in the Finance and other relations to this matter were false.
