The company employs a big staff of highly-paid mechanics.

Bert Taylor, who has been foreman on the Essex section of the M. C. R., has been appointed roadmaster between Tilsonburg and Welland.


BANDITS BEATEN OFF BY KITCHENER MAN

GUIDE IS NAMED AS CO-RESPONDENT

Multi-Millionaire Banker Accuses Half-Breed Indian in Divorce Case.

NEW YORK, March 11.—(By Canadian Press.)—Fred Beaulieu of Three Rivers, a guide, has been named as co-respondent in his action for absolute divorce from Mrs. Stillman, formerly "Pip" Potter, and a famous beauty. An extraordinary feature of the case is that Mr. Stillman has named as co-respondent with his wife the boy, Guy Stillman, who is only two years and four months old. The complaint in the divorce case states that Beaulieu is a "half-breed Indian guide," and that Mrs. Stillman referred to him as "Apollo Belvedere" and "a bronze statue."

The crux of the bitter legal struggle that appears inevitable if the case goes to trial will be the right of the boy Guy to inherit a great fortune. Many millions are involved.

According to evidence already adduced before the referee in the case at Foughkeissie, "Apollo Belvedere" and Mrs. Stillman met in the summer of 1917 at the Stillman's camp, "Stillness," near Three Rivers, where the valet was employed as a guide. He is 28 years old, six feet tall, handsome and stalwart. According to the reports available, he was an unusual guide in that he was well educated and took the position for the summers only.

During the summer of 1917, it is stated, Mrs. Stillman was at the camp with her two children, Anne and James, but Mr. Stillman was away most of the time. A number of witnesses from Three Rivers have already been heard by the referee.
