CANADIAN PACIFIC FIRM-MAR-KET GENERALLY STRONG-WAR EAGLE GAINS 6 POINTS.

Notwithstanding the higher level of the mar'.et, buyers are evidently as much in evidence at top prices as they were when stocks were considerably lower, and the general opinion that prices will still go higher, encourages the carrying of stocks. Brokers look for a general movement throughout the list, and unless the unforseen should happen, there is apparently nothing outside of the monetary situation

to prevent stocks going higher.

London cables for C.P.R were at an advance of \(\frac{1}{2}\). The gain here was equal to \(\frac{1}{2}\) with sellers asking 86\(\frac{1}{2}\). It was not heavily dealt in, 550 shares changing hands.
