Third s. of John Doull, merchant, by Jane Craig, both of Wick, who emigrated to this country in 1828. B. in Wick, Caithness-shire, Scot., in 1828. Ed. at Pictou Academy. M., in 1852, at Pictou, Janet Crichton, dau. of James Crichton, Esq.; grand-dau of the late Hon. David Crichton, M.L.C. She died in 1869. A Lieut. Col. of Militia. Was Treas. of Co. Pictou for 15 years. Represented Oddfellows of the Maritime Provinces at meeting of Grand Lodges at San Francisco, 1869. A Dir. of the Pictou Bank. Sat for Pictou in House of Commons from 1872 until 1874. Defeated at g.e. in 1874 by one vote. Again returned at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative and in favour of the N.P.—Pictou, N.S.

Drew, George Alexander. (North Wellington.)

S. of John Drew and Margaret McKay. Great grand-s. of a Highland Scotch U.E. Loyalist. B. 21 Feb. 1826, in Co. Glengarry, Ont. Ed. at Grammar School at Williamstown and Cornwall. M., 1st, 6 May 1856, Elizabeth Mary, eldest dau. of the late John Jacob, of Post de Grave, Newfoundland, (she died); 2nd, 6 July 1863, Marie Louise, second dau. of the said John Jacob. Studied law under the late Hon. John Sandfield Macdonald. Called to the Bar 1854, and apptd. Queen's Counsel, 18 Dec. 1872. First elected to Parlt. for North Wellington at g.e. 1867. Defeated at g.e. 1872, and again in 1874 by a majority of 6. On his opponent, Col. Higinbotham, being unseated on petition, again contested seat and was defeated by a majority of 3. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative and always a supporter of Sir John Macdonald and his Governments. In favour of a National Policy and the early completion of a through Pacific Railway.—Elora, Ont.
