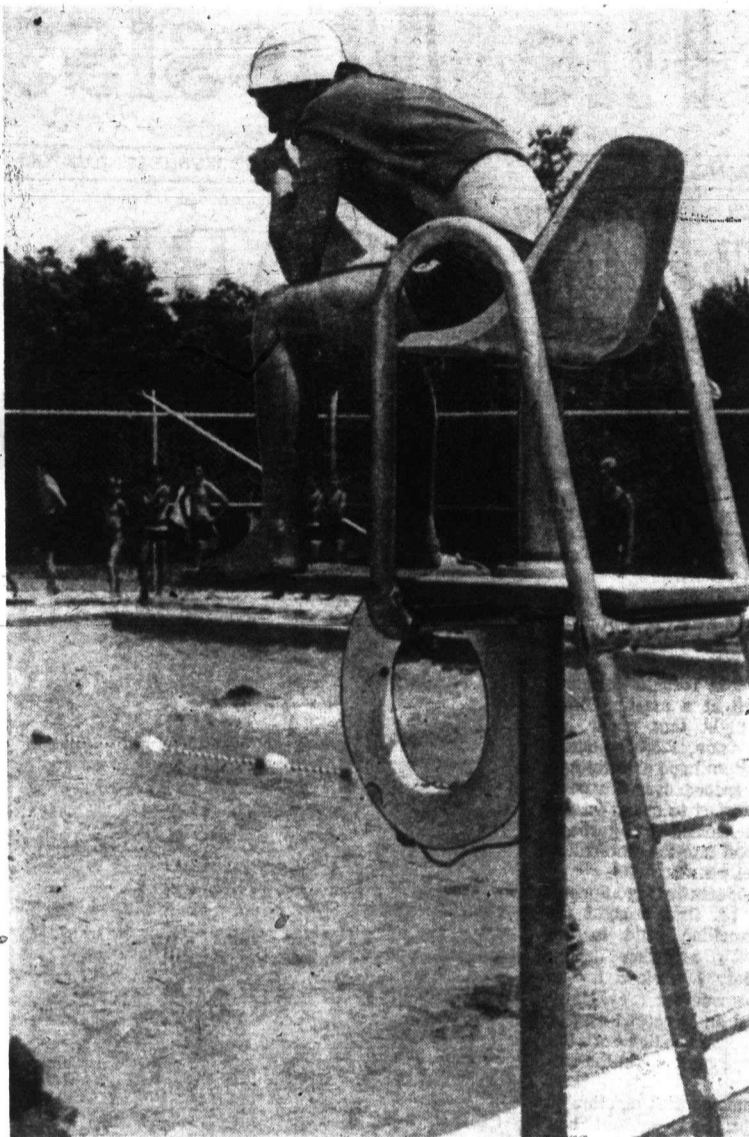

Teach-In Is Held

PARK ROYAL — Lively debate highlighted the policy teach-in held in Park Royal Public School. More than half the audience of 25 took part in the debates on a regional government for a part of Peel County, new methods of policy making in education, revised labor legislation and citizen participation in a democracy. Policy ideas approved were referred to the Peel South NDP executive for formulation into resolutions to be debated at the Ontario NDP Convention in Niagara Falls, Oct. 7-10.

A second policy teach-in in September was requested by the audience. Details will be announced later.

Delegates and alternates elected to represent Peel South at the Provincial Con-

vention were: Bev Aishford, Ron Duncan, Charles Jenkins, Bob Roberty and Rev. Keith Woollard of Cooksville; Ed Bil, Neil Davis and Don Bradley of Clarkson; Hugh Watson, George and Reita Ives of Lakeview. Convention delegates representing local unions affiliated with the NDP include Lou Nicholas of Cooksville, Oliver Fiske and Dick McPherson of Lakeview and Jim Austin of Clarkson.

Charles Jenkins, former Toronto Township Councillor, opened the discussion on the need for strong regional governments which would coordinate the economic, social and welfare planning of areas including a number of existing local governing bodies.
