Camp Borden	20-2-45		<p>0800 hours, ceiling and visibility zero, no flying day or night due to snow.</p> <p>It was with great consternation that our Commanding Officer learned this morning that the AOC had an important appointment in Toronto in the late afternoon, and of course his aircraft was grounded due to the severe snow-storm. Shortly after lunch Group Captain Harvey rushed the AOC and his party to Bog Road Station to catch the C.P.R. local to Toronto when it was realized that it was the only way to get to Toronto on time. Upon arriving at the station it was found that the coaches of the train were practically bulging, they were so crowded.
