From Mr. Goddard I learn it is expected that besides the six scrutineers who will go overseas, about sixty special returning officers and clerks will be appointed for special overseas service in connection with the election, thirty by Sir Wilfrid and thirty by the Government. These men will divide up among themselves the work of visiting the different camps in England and France to determine the polling divisions and subdivisions that should be established and to appoint Deputy Presiding Officers in each district. This makes it desirable that the Liberal representatives should be supplied with as many names as possible of men who may be counted upon for such service. The more names from North York suggested the better, whether the men have gone forward in battalions recruited in North York or not.
