I thank you for sending me the editorial referring to Mr. Rockefeller's address. I have no doubt that some conversation of yours with Mr. Atkinson was responsible for it, as well as for the very kind editorial he had a day or two previous with reference to my speech in Montreal. I had a short talk with Mr. Atkinson before I left for Chicago on Monday over a week ago. We are so wholly at one on the whole program of social reform that I cannot value too deeply his sympathetic interest in what I also am attempting along these lines.

I had a letter from Sir Wilfrid a day or two ago, expressing the hope that I would come back to Canada as soon as my present engagements here were completed. He speaks of the possibility of the arrangement being consummated of which I spoke to you. I have written Sir Wilfrid that I shall be glad to get back just as soon as I can finish up with present engagements.
