said there were good men available but would not express an opinion as to his probable successor. Owing to his stand in this matter he is not so vitally interested in revision in revision. He said however, he wished to have the best done for his successor, although owing to pressure of business he cannot give personal attention to the revision of the lists. He requested that a special effort be made to revise Chatham and Zone Townships. The balance of the Riding is practically well looked after. He suggested that the General Office communicate with the list of workers in Chatham and Zone Townships, and urge them to give attention to the lists. The lists are not yet posted for these Townships. Wallaceburg Liberals will co-operate on stirring up the local workers in Chatham and Zone Townships.

SEPTEMBER 16th

Secretary L.J. Reycraft writes from Ridgetown. " I sent a letter to the chairman and Secretary of each Municipality and urged upon them the necessity of having the lists carefully revised saying that it was of the utmost importance for us that there should be no delay whatsoever in the matter. I know that in many cases they have looked after the matter carefully, but am not in a position to speak definitely as to all. I am writing a second letter hoping that it may stir up any who have not paid due attention to the first."

KINGSTONJULY 18th, 1912

Organizer W.F. Summerhayes visited Kingston to-day and reports that he conferred with President R.F. Elliott, and Secretary J.B. Gordon. The Kingston assessment starts on 1st May. Being a City they depend on registration and do not annually correct the lists. At present there is no Dominion or Provincial candidates in sight. Mr. J.M. Mowat having left Kingston for Vancouver the Association will be re-organized at once. They are keeping matters alive and have prepared the classified list of names for Ottawa Information Office.
