Dear Mr. Mackenzie King,

I shall be very glad if you can spare a few minutes to see me before you leave London, as I want to have a short talk with you - particularly about emigration of our Methodist emigrants to Canada.

During the last two years the average number of Methodists emigrating to Canada has fallen from 15,000 to about 1,200 per annum. I wanted to speak to you about this particularly, as some of our Methodist friends in Canada are rather concerned that there has been such a diminution in the tide of emigration to your Dominion.
