



Ottawa, February 8, 1911.

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 27th ultimo, reporting applications of certain Indians of the Six Nations Band for permission to cut timber on their locations for sale, and in reply to inform you that permits may be given them on the usual conditions of clearing, fencing and putting the area stated under cultivation within two seasons, or sowing thereon sufficient grass and clover seed to prevent the growth of noxious weeds, and in the event of failure to comply with these conditions, dues should be collected on the quantities sold at tariff rates.
